

Henderson Bay Big Picture Exhibition #1- Showcase of Learning

At the end of the first quarter all students will present their learning through an exhibition. An exhibition is a public showing of what students have done and what they have learned through the process. For Exhibition #1 we ask students to prepare a Showcase of Learning, a highlight of their work during the first 9 weeks of school.

Students will share ONE learning experience of their choice from the first nine weeks of school. A learning experience can be from a project (individual, mini-class or advisory), an internship or job shadow. This should be a showcase of their learning during this first quarter of school. Students should highlight new learning and demonstrated growth.

Some areas to **consider** in preparation for this exhibition (this is not an exhaustive list nor a checklist):

- What **learning experience** (project, internship, mini-course) is the best example of my learning during this time period?
 - Describe what you did with as much detail as you can.
- What did I do during this experience
 - What was my initial plan?
 - What steps did I take?
 - How did my plan change?
- How does this show me as an Empowered, Curious or Compassionate learner?
- What did I accomplish at the end of this learning experience?
- Why did I choose to take on this challenge?
- What did I learn while doing this learning experience?
 - About myself?
 - About the content?
 - About the world I live in?
- What evidence do I have from this experience to show my learning?
- What am I most proud of as I look back on this experience?
- What would I change about the experience?
- Why was this a challenge for me?
- What can I do now that I couldn't before?
- What do I want to do (or what am I doing) next to build on this experience?
- What learning is missing that I need to show in the future?

Students will share their experience to a small group of staff and students. Students should plan for 6-10 minutes of sharing, include visuals that enhance the presentation and be able to answer questions about their experience.
